# What is domestic violence?

Domestic violence is a pattern of coercive control that includes the use of one or any combination of physical, emotional, sexual, digital, and economic abuse. Domestic violence does not discriminate and spans all races, ages, cultures, and socioeconomic lines. Additionally, it occurs between blood relatives as well as married and dating partners and can happen in heterosexual or same sex relationships.

# Domestic violence is about power and control.

- Domestic violence is the single major cause of injury to women.
- 30% of female homicide victims are killed by their husbands or boyfriends.
- 1 out of 5 college students is involved in a violent relationship.

The mission of Domestic Violence Services of Southwestern PA (DVSSP) is to increase awareness of domestic violence and its effect on the community, to empower those victimized by providing advocacy and safe and effective services, and to work for social change designed to eliminate domestic violence.

## **PROGRAMS AND SERVICES**

**24/7 Hotline:** We provide crisis counseling, safety planning, support, information and referrals to victims of domestic violence, their family, friends, and assisting agencies.

**Emergency Safe House:** Safe housing for up to 30 days for victims of domestic violence and their children. Food, clothing, and personal care items as needed. 24-hour transportation with intake.

**Empowerment Counseling and Support Group:** Free individual and group counseling for anyone who is or has been directly involved in an abusive relationship.

**Children's Program:** Daily programs offered for children residing within our facility. One-on-one and group counseling activities.

**Legal Advocacy:** We provide free and confidential assistance with filing Protection from Abuse Orders, court accompaniment, support, information, and advocacy as victims progress through the legal system.

#### **Prevention, Education, and Training:**

School programs are offered to all grade levels focusing on violence prevention. Presentations and trainings are also offered to local businesses, agencies, civic, and religious groups.

All services provided by DVSSP are free and confidential.
