CASE MANAGEMENT

Shelter staff are counselors, supporters, and advocates of survivors. Staff will assist clients in creating goals, connecting with community resources, and meeting immediate and long-term needs.

COURT ADVOCACY

Domestic Violence and sexual assault can be complex issues to pursue in court. Legal Advocates assist victims throughout court processes by providing information, advocating on behalf of the client, and offering emotional support.

EMERGENCY SHELTER

Emergency shelter services are available to victims and their children. They will have access to a fully stocked kitchen, comfortable living area, laundry room, and a bed. Shelter counselors are available 24/7.

COUNSELING & THERAPY

Women's Center of Beaver County provides trauma counseling and therapy to all survivors regardless of age, gender, sexual orientation, religion, race, or other characteristic.

HOSPITAL ACCOMPANIMENT

Staff is 'on call' 24/7 to accompany a victim in the hospital for a sexual assault examination kit or physical examination of injuries. Staff can provide information of the hospital process, resources, referrals, and emotional support.

SURVIVOR CENTERED CARE

Survivors have unique experiences and complex trauma. Safety, justice, and healing are different to each survivor. The most important part of the Center's services is that they are all tailored to the survivor's needs.



EDUCATION & OUTREACH

The Center employs three full-time staff members dedicated to the education about and prevention of violence. Education and Outreach programs are available to students, parents, professionals, and the community.
